We are grateful and humbled at the opportunity to facilitate this Inquiry and to bring to light harms that often remain unseen or largely ignored. Together we can create the change necessary for a truly clean, green, safe and healthy environment for all.



How to make your Submission



You need to prepare your submission in a saved word or text document beforehand, with any supporting documents or photos. Then click through to the relevant form below to get started.

for those negatively affected or harmed by toxic chemicals or poisons, and those wishing to give evidence about their own experiences or situations they have witnessed.

for scientists, researchers and other experts wishing to share their knowledge and expertise on the impacts and effects of toxic chemicals and poisons on the people, wildlife or environment.

for those working with, or wishing to present, non-toxic solutions and alternatives to toxic chemicals and poisons in use.
